PERMIT TO OPERATE

Pursuant to Section(s) 22a-208a and 22a-454 of the Connecticut General Statutes (“CGS”) and Section 22a-209-4 of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies (“RCSA”), a PERMIT TO OPERATE IS HEREBY ISSUED by the Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection (“Commissioner”) to NLR, Inc. (“Permittee”) to operate the volume reduction plant (“Facility”) located at 250 Main Street, East Windsor, Connecticut. Subsequently, the Permit to Operate No. 0470673-PO issued on January 27, 2005 IS HEREBY REVOKED for administrative purposes.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. This permit is based on and incorporates by reference all documents and specifications submitted as part of Application No. 200903456, including:
 - a. Application form(s) dated September 29, 2009;
 - b. Operation and Management Plan (O&MP) dated 2009; and
 - c. A Site Plan prepared by J.R. Russo & Associate P.E., dated December 11, 2003 (“Site Plan”).

The Permittee shall maintain records of all documents comprising and all data pertaining to the application(s) mentioned in this condition, as well as any supplemental information submitted to the Department in connection with such application(s). Any inaccuracies found in the information submitted by the Permittee may result in revocation, reissuance, or modification of this permit, and civil or criminal enforcement actions.

2. As used in this permit, the following definitions apply:

“Ballast” means a device that electrically controls light fixtures and that includes a “capacitor” or “PCB capacitor” containing 0.1 kg or less of dielectric fluid. The classification of ballasts shall conform with the Draft Fact Sheet “Classification and Disposal of Fluorescent Light Ballasts”.

“Capacitor” means a device for accumulating and holding a charge of electricity and consisting of conducting surfaces separated by a dielectric, as defined in 40 CFR 761.3.

“Certified Operator” means the solid waste facility operator or an employee of such operator who is present on site and oversees or carries out the daily operation of the facility, and whose qualifications are approved in accordance with Section 22a-209-6 of the RCSA, which requires that a certified operator is present at the facility during operating hours at all time.

“CFR” means the Code of Federal Regulations as of the date of this permit is issued.

28. Nothing in this permit shall affect the Commissioner's authority to institute any proceeding or to take any actions to prevent violations of law, prevent or abate pollution, recover costs and natural resource damages, and to impose penalties for violations of law.
29. Nothing in this permit shall relieve the Permittee of other obligations under applicable federal, state and local laws.
30. Permit to Operate No. 0470673-PO, issued on January 27, 2005, is hereby expired.
31. This permit shall expire five (5) years from the date of issuance and may be revoked, suspended, modified, renewed, or transferred in accordance with applicable laws.
